Dr. Volker Krause is a professor of political science at Eastern Michigan University where he teaches courses in international relations and comparative politics. Dr. Krause also taught at Northern Arizona University and the University of Michigan. Dr. Krause earned a BA in political science from the University of Mississippi and an MA and a PhD in political science from the University of Michigan.

Dr. Krause's scholarly interests include armed conflict and alliances, international organization, U.S. foreign policy, Canadian politics and foreign policy, as well as Japanese national security. Among his publications are *U. S. Public Policy in an International Context*, a co-authored book, two co-edited special journal issues on military alliances, and several peer-reviewed articles in such journals as the *Journal of World Affairs*, *International Politics*, the *Journal of Peace Research*, *International Relations of the Asia-Pacific*, the *Social Science Quarterly*, and *International Interactions*.

As a 2018-2019 Council on Foreign Relations-Hitachi Fellow, and on sabbatical leave from Eastern Michigan University, Dr. Krause was hosted in the Institute of Social Science at the University of Tokyo conducting research on Japanese elite perceptions of Japan's national security.
